"Plein Air Painting: Masked, Socially Distanced and Sanity Saving"

WHY: Paint outside, in heat, cold, wind, bugs and oh so much more?

- Super challenging
- Super exhilarating
- Great to be in the outdoors
- See with new eyes
- Socially distanced
- Impress people with your tales of endurance without having to hike too far

WHAT: To enjoy time outside:

Bring: Hat, sunscreen, bandanna, bungee cords to clip easel to backpack in windy conditions, bug repellent, small first aid kit, snacks, trash bags, toilet paper and bags for disposal (pack it in, pack it out), hand sanitizer, very light rain poncho or jacket, large garbage bag to cover up your work if it rains. A whistle, mylar emergency blanket, flashlight or headlamp and a calm mind will help if you're stuck somewhere. Learn to layer clothing. Shed a layer when warm, add one when cold.

Gear:

- face mask
- tube paints or pan paints, pastels, etc.
- palette
- panels and paper
- brushes
- empty vessel for water
- easel
- drawing materials (pencils, pens, charcoal, etc.), sketchbook
- phone/camera
- drinking water
- painting water
- paper towels
- backpack

Optional:

- umbrella
- chair/stool
- rolling gear duffel bag (can be a problem if terrain is not smooth)

Consider having an extra mini kit in your vehicle...just in case you forget that brush, your palette, your whatever!
